

The Co-Occurring Disorders Institute.

As of 11/13/2009, CoDI has received information on 62 youth. Three new OSS youth recently were added not included in the 62. We just completed a status review of each case and assigned each into one of six (6) categories: OSS Active, Diversion Active, Tracking, Attempting Contact, Contacted not engaged, Closed.

Following is the breakdown of the **62** by category:

17 (27%) OSS Active Cases (3 new not included)

- 8 in RPTC
- 3 in Level 3 In state
- 2 DJJ/Foster
- 4 Community Services

8 (13%) Diversion Active Cases

- 5 Community Services/Home
- 2 No Star
- 1 Foster Care

10 (16%) Tracking Cases

Regular contact with youth and/or parent. Ongoing care management support.

11(17%) Attempting Contact

Regular attempt to contact and engage the family. Some have disconnected phones or addresses that return.

10 (16%) Contacted did not engage

These are parents that declined services

8 (13%) Closed

- 3 Closed Cases Stable and Moved to Anchorage
- 3 Doing Well and need no further services
- 1 Fired CoDI
- 1 Status Unknown

21 (35%) Families have completed the Parent Management Training (six weeks)
