#### **David Ford, President and CEO, CareOregon**

Dave has been in healthcare insurance leadership roles for over 30 years and is regarded for his visionary, innovative, and cooperative thinking and practice. A strong believer in "World Class Healthcare for All", Dave is an ardent advocate in the national and international arenas, creating appreciation, desire and practices for changes.

Dave has been successful in complete turnaround for several healthcare organizations, the latest being CareOregon. Dave has served as consultant and advisor for venture capital firms, for-profit and non-profit healthcare related entities, and president and CEO for various healthcare organizations.

Dave was recognized with the Visionary Leadership award by the Oregon Health Forum in 2007, and was Co-Chair for the 2009 Institute of Healthcare Improvement's National Forum. #### **David Labby, MD, PhD, Medical Director, CareOregon**

David Labby is Medical Director and Director of Clinical Support and Innovation for CareOregon, a Medicaid Managed Care Plan with 150,000 members. He has been responsible for developing and overseeing the health plan's care management program for members with complex conditions.

Since 2007, he has led CareOregon's Primary Care Renewal (PCR) Initiative to support key network providers in moving to a "medical home" model of care that includes integrated behavioral health. The PCR Initiative has successfully spread to cover 40 percent of the CareOregon membership. He has led a number of other plan clinical efforts, including initiatives on pediatric asthma, chronic pain, and depression. He has been part of CareOregon's participation in the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's (IHI) Triple Aim Initiative and is now part of the Triple Aim Faculty.

Dr. Labby has practiced in primary care, and has held Medical Director positions in multi-specialty and primary care practices, including primary care clinics in the Oregon Health & Sciences University. Dr. Labby received his medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine, and his PhD in Cultural Anthropology from the University of Chicago.
