WIC Success Story:

A family that had recently taken emergency custody of a niece came to WIC; this was so recent that they did not have the custody paperwork. WIC was able to get them emergency formula until their certification was complete, and staff facilitated their working with the OCS system to get their custody paperwork. Once that was in-hand, we enrolled the child in WIC.

Vendor Update:

1. **ACTION REQUIRED for FMNP participating clinics:** ALL unused/non-issued FMNP coupons must be mailed back certified to the State Office no later than Friday, October 31, 2014. Please email your tracking numbers to erin.khmelev@alaska.gov. Packages of remaining coupons can be mailed from each clinic separately. 2. **Farmers' Market Update:** The FMNP season is coming to an end. But on a brighter note, we've already surpassed our 2013 redemption and we expect more deposits up until mid-November! Good job everyone! And thank you for all of your hard work encouraging fresh fruit and vegetable consumption by our WIC participants! Also, Erin Khmelev will be reaching out to the FMNP participating clinics to get an estimate of how many magnets/books are remaining and how they were received. Keep an eye out for her email.

Caseload Updates:

1. State wide update on caseload is that we are slowly gaining caseload as a whole. Since April (caseload 18,886) when we were completely on SPIRIT through September (caseload 20,091) we have seen a 6% gain across the state!

 - a. Walk-in clinics every day.
 - b. Work closely with other programs to promote WIC.
 - c. Stable staff.
 - d. Travel to all their villages.

Policy Update:

1. UHT Policy. We are in the process of reviewing costs of milk packages which include UHT. We also want to monitor how the implementation of the final food rule impacts food package costs before making a final policy determination on how UHT is to be prescribed at the clinic. Due to the cost of milk projected to rise in the coming months and consideration of recent changes to food packages we are not moving forward with any change to the UHT policy at this juncture. We will make a determination after the first of the year and send out policy guidance then. If you have not changed your food packages to implement the proposed UHT policy, you may wait until further guidance comes out in 2015. SPIRIT Information:

⇒ In answer to a request from Clinic staff for the ability to access former WIC participant information as an Outreach method, there is a new report called “**Clinic 88 Outreach**” on the SPIRIT Utilities site: <https://wicspiritprod1.dhss.alaska.gov/WICSPIRITPROD1/SpiritUtilities/Authentication/Login>. This report finds participants who have been in Clinic 88 for up to six months and are less than 4 years old. (Participants are moved to Clinic 88 six months after their certification ends). Because SPIRIT doesn’t “remember” the clinic or agency in which a participant was last active, the report cannot be delivered by Agency/ Clinic. The outreach contacts will have to be determined by their “City.” We suggest that the report is exported to excel and sorted by “City.”

SPIRIT Tips and Reminders:

⇒ Please remember that it is VERY IMPORTANT to “Clear On-Site List” after running batch. After you Put Mail or MOV Participants On-Site, the process should be completed before the end of the day. That includes printing the checks from SPIRIT, downloading the Address List and the Signature Document from the SPIRIT Utilities site, and clearing the On-Site list. This is because the household members are separated during this part of the batch process and the data can be compromised.

⇒ Also remember to:

- Only have one staff person in a participant’s folder (record) at the same time.
- Only have one household member's folder open at a time.
- Change breastfeeding status or amounts through the Mom’s record (Infants Born from This Pregnancy).

Update from YKHC:

Here’s some great news from Amber, the WIC Coordinator from YKHC.

In December 2014 I was able to obtain my master's degree from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. I completed a research project during my time at the University and submitted my abstract to FNCE for approval. My abstract was accepted and I was provided the opportunity to present my poster during the recent FNCE conference. My research topic was "Relationship between Childhood Food Allergies and Family Quality of Life." I examined the effect childhood food allergies have on particular daily family activities including meal preparation, family finances, etc., by sending an online survey through SurveyMonkey to parents enrolled in food allergy support groups due to their child's food allergy/allergies. When the survey data was analyzed, we discovered that families with children who had multiple food allergies eat out less, have less free time, are more likely to live on one income and have additional expenses related to caring for their food allergic child. Survey data suggests that food allergies negatively impact family quality of life in a number of areas, but the family financial impact of childhood food allergies was notably difficult. Also, a high percentage of surveyed parents listed they not allow their allergic child to even attend certain social events such as summer camp or birthday parties because of food allergies. The food allergy field is particularly interesting to me and I do hope research will continue in the field until a cure is found. In the meantime, though, I know it is important for me to help WIC families identify safe and affordable alternatives to allergenic foods.

2. **Time** – Here's how to stop teens from drinking soda
When kids learn how far they'd have to walk to burn off the calories in a soda, they tend to buy smaller sizes or stop buying it altogether, suggests a new [study](#) published in the American Journal of Public Health.

Local WIC agencies that have operated a peer counseling program for at least one year, which meets all of the required core components of the FNS [Loving Support© Model](#) for a successful peer counseling program, are eligible to apply.

The application period will open once annually. **The 2014 application period opens on Monday, September 29, 2014 and closes on Friday, December 5, 2014.**

Review Period and Timeframe

WIC State agencies will review the applications in their State, verify the information is correct, and recommend an award level for the local agencies. FNS Region Office staff will review the States' verification and award recommendation. The review process will utilize the FNS PartnerWeb.

The State agency review period will begin on January 12, 2015 and end on March 27, 2015.

The FNS Regional Office review period will begin on April 27, 2015 and end on May 29, 2015.





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
