1. New Resources Available- “From Coverage to Care”

Check out these new resources which are very helpful to educate consumers on using their healthcare, no matter whether they access it via Medicaid, ACA Marketplace plans, or other forms of health insurance. These materials are free and you can order them in fairly large quantities. You can view them online at <https://marketplace.cms.gov/technical-assistance-resources/c2c.html>. This site also has videos for each chapter.

Order From Coverage to Care and other CMS Materials:

From Coverage to Care is an initiative to help people with new health coverage understand their benefits and use them appropriately to connect to primary care and the preventive services that are right for them, so they can live a long and healthy life. We encourage you to share these resources with consumers, and help them on their journey from coverage to care. We also hope you share information about local resources during your conversations, to help individuals know where and how to access care in your community.

How to order resources from the CMS product ordering website

To order resources, you will need to create an account. To do so, go to <http://productordering.cms.hhs.gov> and select the words “create an account.” There will be a section for justification for access. Please include the type of your organization (for example, “ABC Partnership Group,” an advocacy group of seniors with diabetes) so that we may properly process the request. Within 3 business days CMS will grant approval of the account, and you can log in to order products.

Note: your account won't be accessible until your access is approved. You will receive an email notice of approval.

2. **ENPR Reminder**

One of our ENPR Medicaid providers reports that they're receiving ENPRs without ICD-10 codes, and this is delaying processing. Please be sure you're only using the ENPR with the ICD-10 code (attached) and that if a participant comes into your office with an older form, with no ICD-10 indicated, you need to contact the provider's office and get the ICD-10 diagnosis before sending the ENPR on to Geneva Woods or Procure. When these organizations receive an ENPR without an ICD 10, the form is not complete and it delays processing. Please contact Jennifer Johnson with questions jennifer.johnson@alaska.gov.

3. **Baby Behavior Training**

I checked with Danielle about BB training for people already enrolled in CPA or BFPC training and she said: “Ideally current CPA and BFPC trainees would complete the Baby Behavior training in the training program they are in rather than the general Baby Behavior training for everyone. They can skip right to it in either of the trainings. For CPA's the Baby Behavior training is located in the Maternal, Infant and Early Child Course under Module 5- Infant Feeding and for BFPC's the Baby Behavior training is located in Module 10. If/when they complete it in the stand alone version it will not track within their training program. I can however look it up and override their grade making note that they took it in the stand alone training.” Danielle sent me the lists of CPAs and BFPCs who've already completed it, so check with me if you have a question. 4. **Label Change for Similac Advance**

Attached is a form showing the label change to Similac Advance that we should start seeing
