

Restaurant and Food Service Facilities in Alaska Where Frozen Strawberries Were Served in the Past 2 Weeks

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is recommending that *persons who consumed frozen strawberries in the following restaurant and food service facilities within the past 14 days AND who are not already immune to HAV should contact their health care provider as soon as possible to get post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).*

Below is the list of venues that have confirmed receipt of recalled product in the past 2 weeks. This list will be updated as more information becomes available.

Venue	Address	Last possible day implicated strawberries may have been available
Grand Aleutian Hotel	Dutch Harbor/Unalaska 498 Salmon Way	Nov 3

Persons who do **not** need PEP include those who:

- are immune to HAV, i.e., those who have received at least one dose of single-antigen HAV vaccine, those who have had previous HAV infection, and those who are HAV IgG positive;
- ate fresh strawberries or frozen strawberries they bought in a retail store; or
- ate frozen strawberries in restaurants and food service facilities more than 14 days ago, as PEP has limited effectiveness after this timeframe.
