

## HIV Surveillance Report — Alaska, 1982–2014

From January 1, 1982 through December 31, 2014, 1,616 cases of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection were reported to the Alaska Section of Epidemiology (SOE), including cases with an initial diagnosis in Alaska and those previously diagnosed out of state who are living in Alaska (Table). During 2014, 76 cases of HIV infection were reported to SOE; 42 (55%) of which were initially diagnosed in Alaska, yielding a statewide incidence rate in 2014 of 5.7 cases per 100,000 persons. This HIV Surveillance Report contains summary data and highlights for cumulative cases reported from 1982 through 2014 (n=1,616), incident cases diagnosed in Alaska in 2014 (n=42), and Persons Living with HIV in Alaska as of December 31, 2014 (n=618).

## Reported Cases of HIV, 1982–2014

### Highlights Cumulative HIV Cases 1982–2014, n=1,616

- 1,086 (67%) were also diagnosed with AIDS
- 575 (36%) are known to have died
- 1,304 (81%) were male
- 811 (50%) were Men Who Have Sex with Men (MSM); 300 (19%) were Heterosexual (Hetero)
- 877 (54%) were White; 326 (20%) were Alaska Native/American Indian; 203 (13%) were African American
- 1,137 (70%) had an initial diagnosis in Alaska; 797 (70%) of those were living in Anchorage/Mat Su at the time of diagnosis

Figure 1. Reported Cases of HIV and Known Deaths by Year of Diagnosis, Alaska — 1982–2014




Figure 2. Reported Cases of HIV by Age at Diagnosis and Gender, Alaska — 1982–2014




Figure 3. Reported Cases of HIV by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Alaska — 1982–2014




Figure 4. Reported Cases of HIV by Transmission Category, Alaska — 1982–2014





Figure 5. Reported Cases of HIV by Residence at Diagnosis, Alaska — 1982–2014



## Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska, 2014

### Highlights Newly Diagnosed HIV Cases 2014, n=42

- 6 (14%) were also diagnosed with AIDS
- None are known to have died
- 34 (81%) were male
- 25 (60%) were Men Who Have Sex with Men (MSM); 14 (33%) were Heterosexual
- 19 (45%) were White; 11 (26%) were Alaska Native/American Indian; 8 (19%) were African American
- 32 (76%) were living in Anchorage/Mat Su at the time of diagnosis

Figure 6. Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska By Year — 2005–2014




Figure 7. Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska by Age at Diagnosis and Gender — 2014




Figure 8. Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska by Race/Ethnicity and Gender — 2014




Figure 9. Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska by Transmission Category — 2014





Figure 10. Reported Cases of HIV Newly Diagnosed in Alaska by Residence at Diagnosis — 2014




## Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Alaska as of December 31, 2014

**Highlights**

**Persons Living with HIV in Alaska  
As of December 31, 2014, n=618**

- 340 (55%) were also diagnosed with AIDS
- 484 (78%) were male
- 286 (46%) were Men Who Have Sex with Men (MSM); 151 (24%) were Heterosexual
- 302 (49%) were White; 117 (19%) were Alaska Native/American Indian; 87 (14%) were African American
- 406 (66%) had an initial diagnosis in Alaska; 283 (70%) of those were living in Anchorage/Mat Su at the time of diagnosis
- 433 (70%) are virally suppressed

Figure 12. Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Alaska by Age at Diagnosis and Gender — As of December 31, 2014




Figure 13. Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Alaska by Race/Ethnicity and Gender — As of December 31, 2014




Figure 14. Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Alaska by Transmission Category — As of December 31, 2014




Figure 15. Persons Living with HIV/AIDS in Alaska by Residence at Time of Diagnosis — As of December 31, 2014
