

SECTION 1: DEMOGRAPHIC, SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC PROFILES

Overview

Section 1 introduces some of the main demographic, social and economic factors that affect the health of Alaskans and describes the scope and context for efforts to improve population health. Data regarding these are presented in the following categories and order:

- Population;
- Educational and Linguistic Factors;
- Economic Status; and
- Employment.

The table numbers shown below correspond with the appropriate tables in Section 1.

Population

Figure 1.005 – Map of Alaska Regions and Census Areas/Boroughs

- Regions – 29 Alaska census areas and boroughs are clustered into six geographic regions, the same as Economic Areas as defined by the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development. The six regions are Anchorage/Mat-Su, Gulf Coast, Interior, Northern, Southeast and Southwest. Data in this publication are reported at the census-area level, when possible.

Table 1.010 – Population by Age and Race, Census 2010

- Population - The Alaskan population was 710,231 as measured in the 2010 Census. Using census categories, 473,576 persons reported as white race alone, 104,871 as Native American alone, 23,263 as African American alone, 38,135 as Asian American alone, and 7,409 as Hawaiian and Pacific Islander alone. The number of persons who listed themselves as two or more races was 51,875 and as Hispanic Origin or Latino was 39,249.
- Median Age - The median age in the state was 33.8 years in 2010. Children are most likely to be identified as being of two or more races. By race group, the median age for “two or more races “ was 17.7 years, younger than other race groups.
- Male-to-Female Ratio - Statewide, there were 108.5 males for every 100 females. This number is significantly lower among people whose race is Asian alone, at 87.8 males per 100 females, and is highest among the White population, at 112.0 males per 100 females.
- Youth Dependency Ratio - This ratio represents the population under 18 compared to working age population. The statewide youth dependency ratio was .40, or 4:10. Some groups had substantially higher youth dependency ratios. Native American, Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, and Hispanic or Latino populations also have notably high ratios relative to the state as a whole at .54, .64, and also .64, respectively.

- Aged Dependency Ratio - This ratio represents the population 65 years old and older divided by the working age population. The aged dependency ratio was .117 statewide.

Table 1.015 – Population, by Race, Ethnicity and Census Area, Census 2010

- Race – Census categories and counts are white alone, 483,873 or 68.1 percent; Native Alaskan/American Indian, 106,268 or 14.9 percent; African American alone, 24,441 or 3.4 percent; Asian alone, 38,882 or 5.5 percent; Pacific Islander, 7,662 or 1.1 percent; and Two or More Races, 49,105 or 6.9 percent.
- American Indian/Alaska Native Population – There were 106,268 American Indians/Alaska Natives in Alaska, constituting 15 percent of the population overall. The Anchorage/Mat-Su region had the greatest number of American Indians/Alaska Natives, 28,849 persons or 27 percent. The regions with the greatest population of American Indians/Alaska Natives by percent of region were Northern region, at 70 percent or 18,478 persons, and Southwest region, with 69 percent Native American population within its region, or 27,851 persons.
- Hispanic Origin - There were 39,249 persons of Hispanic origin or Latino, of any race, or 6 percent of the Alaska population overall. The Anchorage/Mat-Su region had the greatest number in this category compared to the total population, or 25,362 persons, with the Anchorage census area accounting for 22,061.

Table 1.016 – Population, by Race, Alone or in Combination, Census 2010

- Race Alone or in Combination– Counts are white, 527,709 or 69.1 percent; Native Alaskan/American Indian, 139,762 or 18.3 percent; African American, 34,167 or 4.5 percent; Asian alone, 50,943 or 6.7 percent; and Pacific Islander, 11,360 or 1.5 percent.
- American Indian/Alaska Native Population, Alone or in Combination – There were 139,762 American Indians/Alaska Natives in Alaska in 2010, 18.3 percent of the population overall. The Anchorage/Mat-Su region had the greatest number of American Indians/Alaska Natives, 45,890 persons.

Table 1.020 - Population, Housing Units and Density, Census 2010

- Population by Region – The 2010, the Anchorage/Mat-Su region population was 380,821, or 54 percent of the Alaskan population.
- Density of Population and Housing - The Anchorage census area is Alaska’s most dense. Other areas of the state have much lower populations per square mile, ranging from less than .1 person per square mile for the Yukon-Koyukuk census area to 13.2 persons per square mile for the Fairbanks North Star Borough. Other areas of the state also have markedly lower housing densities. Average household size for the state is 2.65.

Table 1.030 – Population 1990, 2000, 2010 and Estimates for 2011 and 2012, by Census Area/Borough

- Population Change by Region - Alaska statewide population estimates indicate a 1.3 percent increase in Alaska's population from 2011 to 2012. The Interior region experienced the highest growth rate, 2.4 percent, or 2,689 persons. All other regions of the state experienced modest population increments. At the census area/borough level, however, Bristol Bay and Yakutat populations were estimated to have decreased substantially, at -3.7 percent and -3.9 percent respectively.

Table 1.040 - Age Distribution and Dependency, 2010

- Dependency Ratio by Region - The dependency ratio is the population under age 18 plus the population 65 and over, divided by the number of people age 18 through 64. The statewide dependency ratio was .52. The Southwest and Northern regions had the highest dependency ratios, with .60 and .57 respectively. There was notable variation within the Southwest region, with census area dependency ratios as low as .20 in the Aleutians East Borough to as high as .89 in Wade Hampton. The Interior region had the lowest dependency ratio, .48.

Table 1.045 - Age Distribution and Dependency, Estimated 2012

- Dependency Ratio by Region - The dependency ratio is the population under age 18 plus the population 65 and over, divided by the number of people age 18 through 64. The statewide dependency ratio was .53. The Southwest and Northern regions had the highest dependency ratios, with .58 and .58 respectively. There was notable variation within the Southwest region, with census area dependency ratios as low as .22 in the Aleutians East Borough to as high as .85 in Wade Hampton. The Interior region had the lowest dependency ratio, .50.

Table 1.050 - Population Age 65 and Over, Census 2000 and Census 2010

- Population Change - the statewide population age 65 and older increased 54 percent, or 19,239 persons. Increases occurred in every region. Northern region, with the least increase, was at 21 percent. Interior, Gulf Coast, and Anchorage/Mat-Su regions at 63, 62, and 59 percent increases respectively had the greatest increases.
- Gender Comparison – males comprised 49 percent of the population 65 years old and older population, or 26,806 persons, and females comprised 51 percent, or 28,132 persons.

Educational and Linguistic Factors

Table 1.060 - Educational Attainment, Males, 2006-2010

- High School – Statewide, of males 25 years and older, 30 percent had a high school education and 10 percent had less than a high school education. Northern region had the highest percent of males with a high school education, at 47 percent. The Southwest region had the highest percent of males with less than a high school education, 26 percent.
- College – Statewide, of males 25 years and older, 28 percent had attended some college and 33 percent had attained an college degree of Associate or more. The Anchorage/

Mat-Su region had the highest percent with a college degree at 37 percent. All regions had at least 20 percent with some college. Northern and Southwest regions had the lowest rates for post-secondary education degrees with 13 and 14 percent, respectively.

Table 1.070 - Educational Attainment, Females, 2006-2010

- High School – Statewide, of females 25 years and older, 25 percent had a high school education and 9 percent had less than a high school education. Northern region had the highest percent of females with a high school education, at 35 percent. The Southwest region had the highest percent of females with less than a high school education, at 23 percent.
- College – Statewide, of females 25 years and older, 28 percent had attended some college and 37 percent had attained an college degree of Associate or more. The Anchorage/Mat-Su region had the highest percent with a college degree at 40 percent. All regions had at least 23 percent with some college. Southwest and Northern regions had the lowest rates for post-secondary education degrees with 20 and 21 percent, respectively.

Table 1.080 – Alaskans Age 25 and Older, Educational Attainment, 2000 and Estimated 2010

- Change in High School or More – In 2010, 90.7 percent of all Alaskans age 25 or older had obtained a high school diploma at minimum, including 27 percent who had also earned a bachelor’s degree or more. The number of Alaskans who had earned a high school diploma or more increased by 2.9 percent between 2000 and 2010. The Southwest region had the lowest regional rate at 75.0 percent.
- Change in Bachelor’s Degree or More – In 2010, 27.0 percent of all Alaskans age 25 or older had earned a bachelor’s degree or more, up from 25.3 percent in 2000. The total number of persons with a bachelor’s degree or more increased by 20.9 percent during the 2000 to 2010 period.
- Bachelor’s Degree or More – The Southwest region had the lowest regional rate at 12.2 percent. Among census areas and boroughs, Wade Hampton had the lowest rate of bachelor’s degrees or higher at 7.7 percent and Juneau had the highest rate at 34.7 percent.

Table 1.090 - Language Spoken at Home, 2006-2010

- Regional Variation – In 2010, 17 percent of Alaskans, 105,675 persons spoke a language other than English in their home. Regional variation was considerable, ranging from a lows in Southeast, Gulf Coast, and Interior of 10, 12, and 12 percent to a high in Southwest of 60 percent.

Table 1.100 - Language Other than English Spoken at Home, 2006-2010

- Prominence of Languages Other than English – 105,752 Alaskans lived in a home where a language other than English was spoken. Of these, 32,166 persons were in homes where [Alaska Native and American Indian] languages [other than Navajo] were spoken, followed by Spanish or Creole, at 22,447, and Tagalog, at 14,857. 36,282 other persons spoke languages other than those listed above or English.
- Native Languages - In the Southwest region, Alaska Native languages were by far the most common languages other than English spoken in the home, with 15,594 speakers. This was also true for the Northern region, with 7,988 speakers. In the Anchorage/Mat-Su region, Spanish or Creole was the most common single non-English language spoken,

with 12,883 speakers, but there were also 23,582 speakers with a language other than English, Spanish, Creole, Tagalog or Native Alaskan spoken in their homes.

Economic Status

Table 1.110 - Household Income, by Region, American Community Survey, 5-year Estimate, 2006-2010

- Limited Income – 4.3 percent of Alaska households had incomes of less than \$10,000. 15.9 percent, about one in six, had incomes of less than \$25,000. Southwest, among the six regions, had the greatest proportion of households with limited income, at 23.6 percent.

Table 1.115 - Household Income, by Region, American Community Survey, 5-year Estimate, 2007-2011

- Limited Income – 37,073 households had incomes of less than \$25,000, 14.7 percent.

Table 1.120 - Per Capita Income, 2006-2010

- Census Areas Compared – Statewide per capita income increased by 36 percent from 2000 to 2010. By census area, the per capita income increased in 28 of 29 areas, with Lake the and Peninsula, the exception, decreasing by 1 percent. Southeast Fairbanks and Denali census areas increased significantly, up 66 and 61 percent respectively.

Table 1.130 – Community-Level Per Capita Income, Dependency Ratio, & Percent Below Poverty, American Community Survey, 5-year Estimate, 2006-2010

- Community data include total population for 2000 and 2010, and 2010 dependency ratio, per capita income, and percent-of-population below poverty level. Data are provided for every community.

Table 1.140 – Regional Per Capita Income, Dependency Ratio, and Percent Below Poverty, American Community Survey 5-year Estimate, 2006-2010

- Regional Variation – Statewide per capita income was \$30,726 and regional per capita income ranged from \$19,730 to \$33,096 in Southwest and Anchorage/Mat-Su regions, respectively. The dependency ratio statewide was .52 percent, and ranged from .48 to .60 percent in the Interior and Southwest regions. The percent of population below poverty statewide was 13.2 percent and ranged from 11.5 percent in both Anchorage/Mat-Su and Juneau regions to 27.1 percent in Southwest.

Table 1.150 - Persons Below Poverty Level and Low Income, American Community Survey 5-year Estimate, 2006-2010

- Poverty Level – 89,125 persons were living below the poverty level and 168,785 person were of low income, 13.2 percent of Alaskans and 25.0 percent, respectively. Southwest and Northern had the greatest regional percentage of persons below poverty level, at 27.1 and 24.8 percent. In Northern and Southwest, persons designated as having low income were the highest percentage regionally also, with 41.7 and 49.6 percent.

Table 1.155 – Ratio of Income to Poverty by Age Group, American Community Survey 5-year Estimate, 2007-2011

- Income data are provided by region by census area/borough by age groups for the persons for whom poverty level could be determined.

Table 1.160 - Children Below Federal Poverty Level, 2010

- Children in Poverty - 32,010 youth below 18 years old were living below the federally designated poverty level, 17.1 percent. Northern and Southwest regions had the greatest percentage of children in poverty, 31.9 and 34.7 respectively. The other four regions were within 2.3 percent of the state average.

Table 1.170 – Homelessness, 2008-2012 and Figure 1.175 – Homelessness, 2008-2012

- Growing Population – In Winter 2012, there were 1,880 homeless Alaskans up 13.8 percent over 1,652 in Winter 2008. Of these, 615, or 32.7 percent, were households with children.

- Table 1.180 - Food Stamp Caseload, 2006-2010

- Change in Population - The statewide monthly average number of food stamp cases was 31,932 in 2010, an increase of 19.4 percent from the 26,745 cases in 2009. Anchorage/Mat-Su had the greatest increase in cases, 25.4 percent or 3,362 cases. Northern and Southwest regions had the least increase at 9.61 and 9.74 percent respectively, or 138 and 253 cases.

- Table 1.190 - Public Assistance, 2006-2010

- Caseload Increase - Statewide, there were 17,766 adult public assistance cases in calendar year 2010, an increase of 4 percent from 2009. Four of six regions had caseload increases of 3 percent or less. Anchorage/Mat-Su had a 6 percent increase, or 551 cases.

Table 1.200 - Women, Infants and Children Program Caseload (FFY 2006 and FFY 2010)

- Statewide increase -- for the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2010, the average monthly WIC caseload was 29,994, a 19 percent increase over the FFY 2006 average monthly caseload of 25,199. Almost half of those cases (14,312 in FFY 2010) were in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region. Every region experienced an increase over the period, although four boroughs had small decreases (Kodiak Island Borough, Aleutians East Borough, and Denali Borough with Haines no change), and Southeast Fairbanks Census Area had an 11 percent decrease between the two periods.

Table 1.210 - Adult Temporary Assistance Program Caseload (2007-2011)

- Caseload Increase - The Adult Temporary Assistance Program (ATAP) is provided for under the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant. Statewide, there were 3,682 Adult Temporary Assistance Program (ATAP) monthly average cases in 2011 compared with 3,248 monthly average in 2007.
- Contextual Issues – The ATAP caseload is affected by the limit of eligibility: the benefit limit is 60 months. In addition, four different tribal organizations now manage about one-third of the 5,700 total Alaska TANF cases. Because these cases are managed separately, those data do not appear in this report. It is thus difficult to determine what trends in the caseload numbers represent.

Table 1.220 – Households with Supplemental Security Income, 2010

- The Supplemental Security Income, or SSI, program is a cash assistance program that provides monthly benefits to persons who have low income or are aged, non-sighted, or otherwise disabled. In 2010, 3.2 percent of Alaskan households received SSI. Southeast had the lowest regional percentage of households with SSI, at 2.5 percent or 725 households. Southwest had the highest regional percentage of households with SSI, at 6.2 percent, or 569 households.

Employment

Table 1.230 – Alaska Labor Force, Males Age 16 Years and Older, 2010

- Male Labor Force – Of Alaskan males age 16 years and older, 210,937 of 274,421, or 76.9 percent, were in the labor force in 2010 and there were 63,484 males unemployed. Labor force rates were the highest for males in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region at 78.6 percent, Southwest at 78.3 percent, the Interior at 77.5 percent, and Southeast at 76.3 percent. The rate was lowest in the Northern region, where 66 percent of males were in the labor force.

Table 1.240 – Alaska Labor Force, Females Age 16 Years and Older, 2010

- Female Labor Force – 169,506 of 253,768, or 66.8 percent, of Alaska’s females Age 16 years and older were in the labor force in 2010 and there were 84,262 females unemployed. Labor force rates were highest for females in the Southeast region, at 68.3 percent. Gulf Coast region had the lowest percentage at 62.9 percent.

Table 1.250 - Unemployment Rate in Percent, January and July, 2009-2011

- Statewide - Alaska’s unemployment rate averaged 7.8 percent in 2011. The highest census area unemployment rate was in Wade Hampton, at 22.6 percent, and the lowest rate was in the Municipality of Skagway, at 2.5 percent.
- Seasonal Variation - Alaska’s unemployment rates routinely show substantial seasonal variation. Statewide summer rates were near or at 7.0 percent unemployment in July of 2009, 2010, and 2011, while winter unemployment rates were at 8.0, 9.2, and 8.8 for the same period. Urban/rural variation tends to occur where economies rely on summer business activity.

Table 1.260 - Monthly Unemployment Percentage Rates, 2011


- Seasonality and Region - In 2011, Alaska’s monthly statewide unemployment rates were lowest during July through October, at 6.8, 6.7, 6.9, and 6.9, and highest in January and February, at 8.8 and 8.7. This pattern holds true for most census areas.

Table 1.270 - Local, Other Alaska Resident and Non-Resident Labor, 2007-2010

- Non-Resident Labor - In 2010, 275,968 workers, 68 percent, of Alaska’s labor force was local, employed within their home census area or borough. 51,054 workers, or 13 percent, were classified as other Alaska resident, Alaskans who work in-state but not in their own census area or borough. 76,073 non-resident, or non-Alaskan, laborers accounted for 19 percent of Alaska’s total labor force in 2010.

Estimated Number of Homeless Alaskans 2008-2012


