- Develop a sustainability plan that addresses our top three priority areas and identify projects that will sustain our current priorities.

- Promote and provide relevant health and wellness trainings for health care providers around our 8 topic areas.
- Co-host disability competency training for health care providers.
- Work with CDPHP on amending existing marketing materials to be more inclusive of PWD
- Work with CDPHP on ensuring Quit Line staff are trained to assist PWD
- Continue to support Adaptive Physical Activity program in Alaska schools
- Partner with the Alaska Cancer Coalition and YWCA on a project that will delivery health messaging to Hope group homes and present to care coordinators about preventative screenings.
- Provide disability-related trainings for healthcare providers regarding access.
- Disseminate Get Ready! Toolkit and SKIP kits.
- Conduct evaluations of all trainings through CHD.

#### TA and Marketing Contract

- Conduct a survey of disability-related programs, agencies, and advocates to identify specialized summer camps for children with disabilities. An online directory of accessible camps will be created.
- Create an emergency preparedness webinar and conduct a follow-up survey of people with disabilities and their change in preparedness
- Conduct a survey of disability-related programs, agencies, and advocates to identify tobacco-free status.
- Work with CDPHP Tobacco Program to disseminate a white paper, materials, and resources to disability programs to promote tobacco-free properties.
- Develop bi-annual newsletter and fact sheets based on the results of our needs assessment.
