


## Strengthening Families Workshop Evaluation Results Fall 2011

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in 5 cities from October 29 – November 12, 2011. A total of 98 evaluations were received from the participants:

- Anchorage = 16
- Fairbanks = 14
- Homer = 18
- Juneau = 26
- Ketchikan = 24

Satisfaction with the workshop was very high:



The rating of the trainers' knowledge was also very good:



The majority of participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:

**Anchorage SF Workshop Evaluation Results  
Fall 2011**

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in Fall 2011. There were 16 participants who completed evaluations in Anchorage.

Satisfaction with the workshop was high: 81% rated it as Very High and 19% rated it as High.

Trainers’ knowledge was rated very high: 100% rated it as Very Good.

Most of the participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:

Fall 2011**

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in Fall 2011. There were 14 participants who completed evaluations in Fairbanks.

Satisfaction with the workshop was high: 86% rated it as Very High and 14% rated it as High.

Trainers’ knowledge was rated very high: 100% rated it as Very Good.

Most of the participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:

Fall 2011**

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in Fall 2011. There were 18 participants who completed evaluations in Homer.

Satisfaction with the workshop was high: 83% rated it as Very High and 17% rated it as High.

Trainers’ knowledge was rated very high: 94% rated it as Very Good and 6% rated it as Good.

Most of the participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:

**Juneau SF Workshop Evaluation Results  
Fall 2011**

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in Fall 2011. There were 26 participants who completed evaluations in Juneau.

Satisfaction with the workshop was high: 48% rated it as Very High, 44% rated it as High, and 8% rated it as Medium.

Trainers’ knowledge was rated very high: 88% rated it as Very Good and 12% rated it as Good.

Most of the participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:

**Ketchikan SF Workshop Evaluation Results  
Fall 2011**

“Training of Trainers” workshops were held in Fall 2011. There were 24 participants who completed evaluations in Ketchikan.

Satisfaction with the workshop was high: 54% rated it as Very High, 38% rated it as High, and 8% rated it as Medium.

Trainers’ knowledge was rated very high: 96% rated it as Very Good and 4% rated it as Good.

Most of the participants reported an increase in knowledge and skills:
