

DJJ COVID-19 VISITATION PHASE SYSTEM (Effective 5/1/2021)

Risk level	What this means:	What to do:
PHASE 0	Youth and/or units who are on quarantine or isolation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspension of all in person family visitation, volunteers, religious services, attorneys, non-essential contractors. Move to virtual family visitation and/or phone calls. • Outside appointments limited to emergent/urgent medical needs-consider telemedicine where appropriate. • Community passes do not occur.
PHASE 1	Any facility located with a community with high community transmission. >10/100,000 Alert Level: High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Limited in person family visitation to include current DJJ Covid-19 mitigation guidelines (universal masking, entry screening, social distancing, etc.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Preference for outdoor visitation whenever possible. * No more than ONE visitor per youth once per week. * Thorough hand sanitizing must occur before and after visitation. * No snacks/food/drinks. * Physical distancing of at least 6 feet between youth and visitor must occur. No physical contact allowed. * Youth and visitor must wear a face covering at all times. Health screening with temperature required of all visitors. Discretion may be used to include temporary suspension of visitation for visitors who do not follow guidelines. Visits should be scheduled and staff pre-screen visitors 24 hours in advance and upon arrival to facility. • Attorney of record may schedule in person appointments M-F 8am-4pm, excluding holidays. If requested, exceptions to these hours can be approved by the facility Superintendent. • Contractors may enter facility to provide approved services under current Covid-19 Mitigation plans. • <i>Limited</i> volunteers/religious services and community partners/grantees may begin scheduling appointments in the facility, WITH PRIOR SUPERINTENDENT APPROVAL through an activity request which includes a mitigation plan. • Any out of facility activity must be approved by the Division Director through an activity request which includes a mitigation plan. PHASE 2	Any facility located within a community with moderate community transmission >5/100,000 Alert Level: Moderate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All phase 1 actions remain in place (universal masking, entry screening, hand hygiene, social distancing, no food/drink etc.) with the following modifications: • Limited in person family visitation as outlined in phase 1 however youth may have TWO visitors, twice weekly. • Volunteers (essential and non-essential), religious services and community partners/grantees may begin integrating into the facility following all mitigation protocols. • Any out of facility or community passes must be approved by the facility Superintendent through an activity request which includes a mitigation plan.
PHASE 3	Any facility located within a community with low community spread Alert Level: Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All phase 1 & 2 actions remain in place (universal masking, entry screening, hand hygiene, social distancing, no food/drink, etc.) with the following modifications: • Resume full visitation and passes with mitigation protocols in place. • Continue entry screenings requirements. • Youth and visitor may engage in brief hug at the start and end of visit.
Misc.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DJJ reserves the right to modify these phases without notice to protect the health of staff and residents • Facility may move to next Phase of visitation after maintaining 7 days in current Phase without change in alert levels which can be found here. • Youth visitation will be allowed only after completion of initial admission quarantine without evidence of illness. Any unit placed on quarantine or medical isolation for confirmed or suspected infection will move to Phase 0 for a minimum of 10 days or as instructed by public health authorities. • SCHOOL-In person schooling will be conducted within each facility in accordance with DJJ and local school district guidance. In the event a housing unit is placed into quarantine or reverts to Phase 0 of this plan, teachers will be restricted from entered the identified unit and must conduct schooling via an online platform until quarantine has
