For the past three years, the National Governor's Association (NGA) Center for Best Practices has been hosting "Chronic Disease Policy Academies" in order to help states develop customized strategies for preventing and managing chronic diseases. In 2004, Alaska was chosen by NGA as one of seven participant states. Priority areas: reduction of obesity and overweight rates through physical activity and healthy eating; reduction of tobacco use and substance abuse; increase use of incentives for individual behavior change; and improvement in secondary prevention and management of targeted chronic diseases.

Comprehensive Integrated Mental Health Plan. (2006). Under AS 47.30.660, this plan is prepared by DHSS in conjunction with the Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority (the "Trust"), the statewide advocacy boards and commissions and other key stakeholders. Called *Moving Forward*, the plan provides a framework from which state, local and tribal partners can set priorities to improve the health status for all Alaskans, with a focus on Trust beneficiaries: people with mental illness, developmental disabilities, chronic alcoholism, and Alzheimer's disease and related disorders. Governor Murkowski expressed commitment to ensuring the state public health agency can meet Alaska's needs during a public health emergency, such as a flu pandemic. At the Alaska Health Summit in late November, DHSS Commissioner Karleen Jackson announced the Governor's proposed \$7.2 million fiscal 07 initiatives for infectious disease control preparedness. Funds will be used for infectious disease control and emergency preparedness, including additional assistance to manage infectious disease and to prepare for emergencies, including a strong public health laboratory system to ensure that infectious diseases are diagnosed rapidly, additional public health nurses to address rising demands of infectious disease prevention and to allow for rapid response in disease outbreaks, and to establish a small supply of antiviral drugs in Alaska. This fiscal year 07 proposal includes a new state investment of \$3.9 million, which matches \$800,000 of federal funds for a total of \$4.7 million. **Immunization and disease registries:** An immunization registry and electronic disease surveillance capacities to help ensure that each child is protected from devastating vaccine-preventable diseases, and to support rapid identification and control of disease outbreaks. Long Term Care and Cost Study (2006) by DHSS and funded by The Trust, will evaluate Alaska's Long Term Care system, including institutional and home and community based services for the following populations: aged, people with dementia, people with traumatic brain injuries, people with physical disabilities, and people with developmental disabilities. The study will determine if Alaska's array of long-term care services offers the same opportunities as other states offer for clients to participate in home and community based services, allowing them to remain in their homes or in the least restrictive setting for long-term care. The study will develop rate setting methodologies for personal care attendants, in-home care options, case management, residential care, assisted living options, including Alaska Pioneers' and Veterans' Home, and nursing facilities. Finally, the study will make other recommendations for developing the most appropriate, sustainable array of long-term care services in Alaska.
