### Dear Tribal Health Leaders

On behalf of the Department of Health and Social Services (the department) and in keeping with the responsibility to conduct tribal consultation, I am writing to inform you of the opportunity to consult on a proposed Medicaid state plan amendment (SPA). The department offers this opportunity concurrent with the public process related to a proposed regulatory change.

## Purpose and content of the proposed amendment:

The department intends the proposed state plan amendment to update *attached sheet to attachment 3.1-A* of the Alaska Medicaid State Plan to reflect the addition of licensed marriage and family therapists (LMFTs) as Medicaid billing providers under the other licensed practitioner benefit.

# Anticipated impact on Medicaid-eligible Alaska Native/American Indian beneficiaries:

The department anticipates the addition of this provider type will increase access to appropriate and timely services for all Alaskans, including American Indian and Alaska Native beneficiaries.

## Anticipated impact on tribal health programs and the Indian Health Service:

Tribal health programs may experience some benefit through increased provider availability for beneficiaries requiring services outside the tribal health system.

#### Mechanism and timeline for comment:

Written comments on the proposed amendment are due no later than 5:00 PM on December 26, 2019. Comments received in response to this consultation letter are for consultation and not comment on the regulations. Comments on the regulations are not comments for consultation on the SPA. If you wish to provide comment for consideration in both the SPA consultation process and the regulations public comment process, you must do so separately.
