RE: Medicaid State Plan Amendment for Tests Ordered by Licensed Practitioners – Tribal Consultation

Dear Ms. King,

The Alaska Native Health Board (ANHB)¹ thanks the Department of Health & Social Services (the Department) for the opportunity to submit written comments for Tribal Consultation on the State Plan Amendment (SPA) to add "licensed practitioners operating within their scope of practice", in addition to physicians, as eligible to order laboratory and radiology services under Medicaid.

We are supportive of these provisions for all non-physician practitioners, including Community Health Aide Practitioners (CHA/Ps), acting within their scope of practice to order laboratory and radiology services. As you know, non-physician practitioners are an important link in the delivery of care in the Alaska Tribal Health System and in the larger Alaska health care system. Allowing licensed non-physician practitioners to order laboratory and radiological services, acting within their scope of practice, enhances the effective delivery of care at all times, and not only during a global pandemic.
