MCAC Member Input

- Philip Recommends the MCAC group should review how the COVID relief funds and stimulus package affects the healthcare in the state.
- Katrina pressing issue is nursing home cost of care. Concern is that elders will have a large financial bill and loss of Medicaid.
- Victoria paying attention to 1115 Medicaid Waiver. Issues with enrollments. Bottle neck of enrollments with providers (facility enrollments and individual provider enrollments).
- Tawnya Only 2 DME's in Alaska and supplies are short forcing many people to seek outside of Alaska. This is a result from cuts on reimbursement and supplies resulting more suppliers pulling out of the state.
- Mary Concern is on the waitlist on waivers and how many people are drawn each year. Concern is on COVID about health care services that kids were receiving at school and with everyone being at home that no one was receiving those services.
- Matt Takes a lot of time for providers to get Medicaid approval for travel and consultations with specialists. It was smooth until the last year. A lot of letters of justification are now required to get approval for travel.
- Robert Long-term care has a lot of challenges with authorizations and sometimes delays. Focus on initial ability from getting someone admitted out of the hospital and into a long-term facility.
- Jeannie Following Medicaid budget to see if budget will be cut. COVID has reduced utilization, reduced travel resulting in savings. Program is looking at saving 100 million dollars in unspent funds. Unfortunately, the money will not carry over into the next year as it will be reallocated into the General Fund.

• Renee – Telehealth has increased by almost 500 providers. In about a month about 15,000 recipients are receiving telehealth and since the pandemic we've spent about 71 million dollars in telehealth services. To date the state has spent 116 million on COVID related claims.
